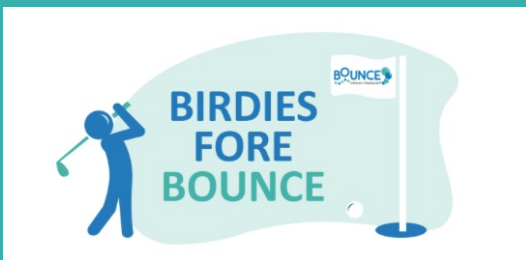
"During my interviews, I enjoyed talking to the wonderful people on the Bounce team and saw myself being part of it. My values align closely with those of Bounce."
